From the Pastor's Desk

October 11, 2016

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is a crisp Autumn day. I love these days. I was reading some devotional material this morning and I was struck by how BRAVE Jesus was and can be when we allow Jesus to live in us.

I could sight many examples. First Jesus sought with all his heart to include people and invite them in. He drew the circle wider and wider. Lepers, so excluded in Jesus' day: they were not to enter the towns or the cities. In including them Jesus went to the length of embracing them and touching them. They were excluded, in part, because people were afraid of contagion, but we exclude people for all sorts of reasons like hatred and fear and prejudice. Jesus was BRAVE.

Jesus was not afraid to correct the behavior of people when it needed to be corrected. Remember the mob chasing the woman caught in the act of adultery. Remember the violence. Jesus stood face to face with that mob. Violence is never the answer.

Jesus was BRAVE.

Jesus said so many wise things. "Judge not unless you want to be judged." (Matthew 7) "And then there's this one "If a man wants your coat, let him have it and your overcoat as well." (Matthew 5) And this one, "It is not what goes into a man that makes him common or unclean. It is what comes out of a man's mouth that makes him unclean." (Luke 15)

Jesus worked so hard at keeping us: his beloved, on the right path. He was so brave.

As we go through the beautiful season of Fall and into the wonderful days of Thanksgiving and Light let us turn to Jesus who worked so hard at transforming us into people of character and compassion.

Enjoy the beauty of God's creation.

The Nursery School welcomed the children and their families back to school in September. After a brief adjustment period, the children are doing beautifully and we are so proud of them.

Autumn is a colorful month in the Nursery School. We have been painting, cutting and gluing all month long using orange, yellow, green and brown as the theme. The children have been watching the trees outside their windows as the leaves change colors and fall to the ground. A group of our three year olds, pictured below, used hand painted telescopes, similar, perhaps to the one Christopher Columbus may have used when he was exploring. They were not exploring the high seas or looking for land, though. Instead they were looking for signs of Autumn.



The weather has been beautiful and the children have continued to use the playground daily. The Fall Festival was a great event which included festival themed activities and pumpkin picking. Fellowship Hall was set up in stations where the children were able to bowl, play in leaves, and ride in wagons, etc. Afterward, they picked pumpkins and played outdoors.

As part of our Fall Festival, each family was given a gift from the Nursery School- daffodil bulbs to plant in their gardens at home. Even though we were celebrating Fall, we look forward to the beauty of spring. It is our hope that the daffodils will bloom each year and remind them of the wonderful days at the UMC Nursery School.



“When We Give, We Receive” is the theme for November. We are reinforcing the meaning of giving and how it makes a person feels to make someone else happy. The children and their families are contributing canned goods and other food items to help the Food Pantry’s mission providing Thanksgiving Baskets for families in

need. The children will participate in another food drive later in the school year when we Block Out Hunger with a breakfast cereal drive.

In December, the crèche made years ago by the children under the direction of Anna McGowan will once again adorn the lobby in the Education Building. As the anticipation for Christmas Day builds, the children will learn that it is a very special birthday that we celebrate and we will again revisit the importance of giving. We will be singing Christmas Carols in the village and giving gifts to our neighbors to celebrate the season.

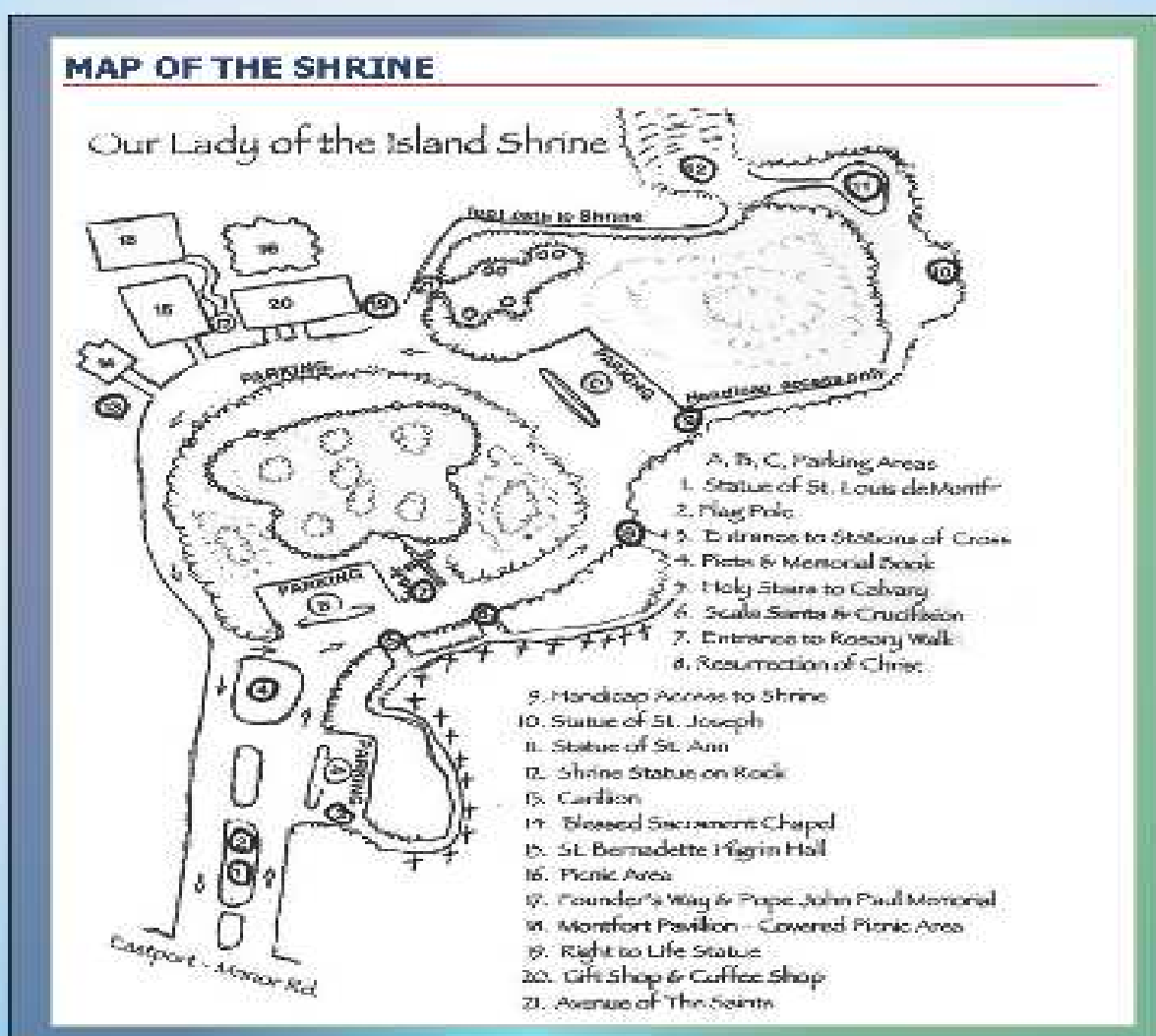

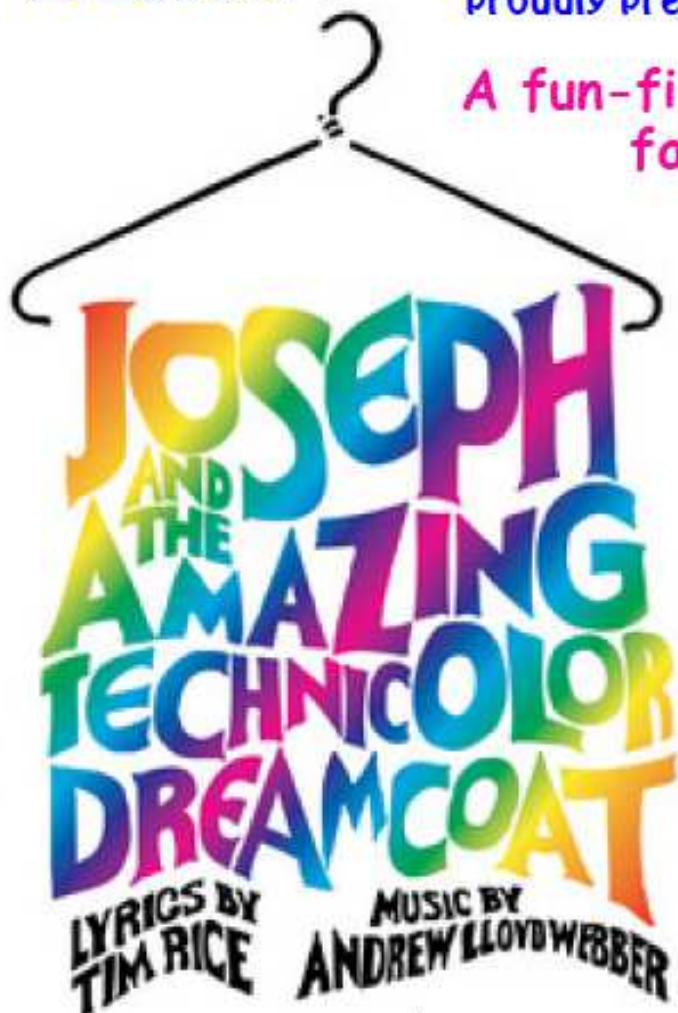
