FINANCIAL NEWS

In the last Newsletter there was a lengthy Financial Update that may have been confusing. Someone asked me "If there is a money crunch why was so much work done on the steeple and the organ?"

Let me clarify what I should have clarified in the first place. In the Methodist Church Trustee Funds and Current Expense Funds are separate.

The Trustees, as part of the responsibility, have to see that the physical plant and property are maintained. Fortunately, the Trustees were blessed financially right at the time when repairs were needed.

These repairs were NEEDED. Both the organ which was sinking into the basement and the steeple which was leaking and rotting because of water damage were in reality threatening the existence of the 1859 sanctuary. It was an emergency. I hope this clarifies the confusion I created.

The place where we struggle to keep us is Current Expense, weekly collections, which go to keep the church running (i.e. salaries, electricity, fuel, etc.) We had planned this year for about \$5,250 to come in each week through regular giving. At present it appears that about \$5,000 comes in weekly after a slow start in January (a cold and snowy January). If we can grow by another \$250 per week that would be prayers answered.

We are happy to announce that almost \$1,000 comes in weekly through automatic

withdrawals from peoples' bank accounts that people have elected to utilize. We are grateful. Call the church office if you would likely your weekly or monthly gifts to automatically come to the church. This is just one method of giving. Regular donations on the collection plate are a blessing, as they always been. Mailed in donations work. If you wish to give to the church, use any method you wish. We thank you for your generosity. God bless you.

The lilies will be delivered to "Our Friends to Remember" after church services on Easter Sunday. Please volunteer to deliver plants after the 11 am service.



Since September they have covered the following studies:

3-Year Old, 4-Year-Old, Kindergarten and 1st Grade; Covered **Faith**, understanding who Jesus is? and how he works in our lives?

2nd and 3rd Grades explored **Unselfishness** learning what Jesus said? Jesus tells us to forgive over and over.

4th and 5th Grades have been inspired to give back to their community by making Birthday Boxes for the Food Pantry and, participating in the Annual St. Patrick's Day Bake Sale to benefit the Bethany House in Roosevelt Long Island. This class also hosted the Valentine's Day Coffee Hour, and are creating many other activities for the classes to come, including ideas towards a Thanksgiving Table Setting event as well as working on homemade Felt Placemats for the Soup Kitchen. Incorporating their Bible stories with each service.

6th, 7th and 8th Grades pore over **confidence** understanding what are God's plans? and having confidence in themselves.

The Confirmation class continues to prepare for their special day when they become full members of the church. Some students have started on their project leading up to Confirmation.

Senior High seminar is having some very in-depth discussions on topics like:

How do we deal with mistakes? How we make them right, and move past them?

Self-identity. How do we define who we are, and if it's even a good thing to "define" ourselves?
